
ABOUT OPERA ANIMATA

Born and raised in central California, **BRANDON ENCINAS (VIOLIN)** began playing the violin at age 10. In 2011 Brandon was the associate concertmaster for the Symphony Orchestra at University of Redlands where he studied music education. Brandon has performed with groups such as the Tulare County Symphony, Fresno Grand Opera, and the Young Musicians Foundation Debut Orchestra. He has played under professional conductors and

composers including Dr. Bruce Kiesling, Inon Zur, Gary Schyman, and Austin Wintory. Brandon has performed in over 30 states as well as in Haiti, Colombia, and Portugal as a traveling violinist and music director with the Celebrant Singers. Brandon is a violin performance major at California State University, Northridge studying under Michael Ferril.



MARY KEATING (VIOLIN) completed her BM in Violin Performance from California State University, Northridge and has collaborated with such well known artists as JMSN, Whitton, Monique Benabou, and Kendrick Lamar (Good Kid, M.A.A.D City). Mary has performed with Shirley Jones and Cathy Rigby, in Jekyll and Hyde (featuring Constantine Maroulis and Deborah Cox) and for former president Jimmy Carster. SYNOPSIS

Scene I: The opera opens with Dido in her home with her attendants. Despite Belinda's efforts, Dido is full of sorrow, explaining that 'Peace and I are strangers grown.' Belinda believes the source of this grief to be the Trojan Aeneas, who visited only months earlier, and suggests that Carthage's troubles could be resolved by marriage. Dido's attendants attempt to raise Dido's spirits, followed by Aeneas's entrance to court. At first, Dido receives him coldly, but she eventually accepts his declaration of love and reunion.

Scene II: The Zombie Sorceress is plotting the destruction of Carthage and its queen, and calls in her minions to aid in her plot. She plans to send one of her most trusted aides, herself, as a Spirit disguised as the god Mercury, to tempt Aeneas to leave Dido and sail to Italy.

Dido and Aeneas, accompanied by their entourage, relax in a parlor in Dido's home. Suddenly, Dido hears distant thunder, prompting Belinda to tell the servants to prepare for a return to shelter as soon as possible. As everyone cleans up and hurries to go, Aeneas is stopped by the Spirit, who is disguised as Mercury. This pretend Mercury brings the command of Jove that Aeneas is to wait no longer in beginning his task of creating a new Troy on Latin soil. Aeneas consents to what he believes are the gods' wishes, but is heartbroken that he will have to leave Dido. Nonetheless, he prepares for his departure from Carthage.

Scene III: As Dido has gone to rest, the three companions keep celebrating the reunion of Dido and Aeneas. The sailor sings a drinking song, which is followed by the zombies' sudden appearance. The zombies are pleased at how well their plan has worked, and the Zombie Sorceress sings a solo describing her further plans for the destruction of Aeneas



MACKENZIE REED (KEYBOARD) is an accomplished Los Angeles-based multi-keyboardist and composer. She received her classical training from Ohio Wesleyan University (BM, 2007) and the California Institute of the Arts (MFA, 2012), as well as private study with world-renowned concert pianists, organists, and harpsichordists in Germany and the USA. She is known for her heavy metalinspired compositions and is frequently sought after as a soloist and collaborator for theatrical productions. Her previous projects include *French*

Horn Recital: The Musical (directed by Kristen Rea), Lamentations – a collection of readings and structured improvisations based on the lament, and Dawn of the Hero – a story about love during the zombie apocalypse accompanied by Beethoven's "Waldstein" Sonata. This is her first zombie opera and hopefully not the last.



After studying biology at University of California, Los Angeles, **SHAWN CAI (VIOLIN)** rekindled his interest in music, and is currently working on his BM in violin performance. He performed in various venues in his youth such as the Walt Disney Concert Hall, Kodak Theatre, and Dorothy Chandler Pavilion. Currently, Shawn plays with various groups, including the American Youth Symphony, YMF Debut Orchestra, and Brentwood Westwood Symphony Orchestra.



SARAHREYNOLDS (SORCERESS) is a singer, voice teacher, and performing arts educator living in Los Angeles. She is a frequent soloist with the Colburn Community Chorale under the direction of Dr. Steven Kronauer, most recently performing Brahms' *Alto Rhapsodie*, Op. 53. Other recent credits include Long Beach Opera (the SoCal premiere of Adam's *Death of Klinghoffer*), Metropolitan Master Chorale (Mozart's *Requiem*), and Southern California Lyric Theater at the

Hollywood Fringe Festival 2013 (*Aesopera*). In 2014 she will perform the roles of Orfeo in Gluck's *Orfeo ed Euridice* with Opera Animata and Bradamante in Handel's *Alcina* with the Napa Music Festival. "on the ocean." The zombies quickly disperse and wait for their next attack.

Scene IV: Dido and Belinda enter, shocked at Aeneas's disappearance. Dido is distraught and Belinda comforts her. Suddenly Aeneas returns, but Dido is immediately suspicious of his true intentions, and his words do not pacify her. She derides his reasons for leaving, and even when Aeneas says he will defy the gods and stay in Carthage, Dido rejects him for having thought of leaving. After Dido forces Aeneas to leave, Dido faces the reality of her situation.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When I came across the idea of putting together a zombie opera, it did not take much time to pair the concept with Purcell's *Dido and Aeneas*. I wanted to experience the zombie apocalypse as it was happening, using a different concept for the undead. What if the undead could still think and plot? Even worse—what if they could unify under a zombie leader with a horrid agenda? What goal could those zombies possibly be working toward?

Dido and Aeneas is built and staged from the zombies' perspective. Once living and breathing themselves, zombies long to return to those lives they once had. Since they cannot come back to normal life, the only solution is to take it from all who still have it. Under their sorceress's leadership, they plot to take away that which they most desire: life.

ALYSSA BRODE (SECOND WOMAN, BELINDA COVER) is a Philadelphia-born soprano whose performance experience spans both coasts. Her recent opera credits include the Fairy Godmother (Massenet's Cendrillon), Laetitia (The Old Maid and the Thief) and the Foreign Woman (The Consul). As a member of the renowned Westminster Symphonic Choir, Alyssa had the privilege of performing symphonic masterworks with some of the world's preeminent conductors (Pierre Boulez, Kurt Masur, Lorin Maazel) and orchestras (New York Philharmonic,

Cleveland Orchestra, Staatskapelle Berlin). Alyssa holds voice performance degrees from Westminster Choir College and California State University, Northridge and is a recipient of the Robert Barbera Scholarship in Voice and the Rachel Ketchie Memorial Award as well as being a recent inductee into the Pi Kappa Lambda music honor society.



Los Angeles soprano KARIBURGESS (FIRST WITCH) has recently performed the roles of Rosalinda in *Die Fledermaus* and Fiordiligi in *Così fan tutte*. She appeared as a soloist in *The Creation* by Haydn and in Beethoven's *Fantasie* with the Oregon Symphony. Some of his prominent roles include Bob in *The Old Maid and the Thief*, Guglielmo in *Così fan tutte*, Le Roi in *Cendrillon* and Jud Fry in *Oklahoma!* Last summer he had the privilege to perform with the American Institute of Musical Studies (AIMS) Festival

Orchestra in Graz, Austria. Awards include Village Voices Scholarship from the Village Voices Chorale, Richard Owens Founder's Scholarship from AIMS, Vocal Arts Graduating Graduate Award from CSUN, and

Previous roles include Rosalinda in Die Fledermaus, Laurie Moss in The Tender Land, and Belinda in Dido and Aeneas. Jenny has also been seen on stage for concert performances of arias from Il trovatore, Carmen, Così fan tutte, and Rusalka. Her 2014 season brings performances as Euridice in Orfeo ed

Euridice, Fiordiligi in Così fan tutte, and the title role in Handel's Alcina. Jenny is a winner of CSUN's and CWU's Concerto Competitions, and a recipient of the Village Voices Chorale Scholarship, Nancy Hooker Scholarship, NATS-LA Summer Study Grant, and the CSUN Graduate Fellowship for Outstanding Research and Creative Activity. She holds a Master of Music in Voice Performance from California State University, Northridge and a Bachelor of Music in Voice Performance from Central Washington University in Ellensburg, Washington. Jenny is an alumna of the programs Classical Singing in New York, LidalNorth in Oslo, Norway, and most recently, the Opera Studio of the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria.
